Residents of Potomac Shores are ready to enjoy summer with multiple activities and endless hours at the pool! New classes for children, adults and families have been added to the calendar at the Social and Fitness Barns; even week-long summer camps are on the roster! There are countless opportunities to keep residents busy including access to the canoe launch and walking trails! All this can be followed by an al-fresco dinner at the Tidewater Grill located at the golf club.

With no reason to leave the Potomac Shores property this summer, your family could plan the best “Stay-cation” ever!

First and foremost, the Potomac Shores Pool opens at 10 am on Saturday, May 27. This kicks off the short-lived, limited “school season” schedule that keeps the pool open Monday-Friday 4 pm to 8 pm and 10 am to 8 pm Saturday, Sunday and Memorial Day.

Regular pool hours, which run from June 16 to August 27, provide plenty of splash time Monday-Friday 11 am-8 pm and Saturday, Sunday and holidays from 10 am-8 pm. New this year: the pool will stay open until 10 pm the first Friday of each month (June 2, July 7, August 4, and September 1).

Looking ahead, be advised that the “school season” schedule will resume August 28 and continue until Labor Day when the pool will close at 8 pm for the year.

Swim classes for kids and adults are in the works, so please inquire at the Fitness Barn. Also, be advised that in-

clement weather can cause the pool to close suddenly for safety reasons. Cabana rentals will once again be available on a first-come- first-serve basis with a rental fee of \$20 per half-day. Ten free guest passes have been mailed to each home in late April; additional passes may be purchased for \$20 per ten passes. Please review the rules for redeeming these passes before use.

There are no plans at this time to open the snack bar on a full-time basis, however, we are hoping to offer snack bar services during limited hours and staffed with volunteers. Volunteers

Personal alcoholic beverages are welcome in the pool area, as long as they are NOT in glass containers. Of course, if you see any illegal or unsafe behavior on the trails (i.e. drug use, alcoholic consumption, fires, motorized vehicles, vandalism), please notify the Trails Committee, who can alert the proper authorities.

Around The Neighborhood - A Developer Update

FAIRWAYS DISTRICT UPDATE

Many of you may have noticed that construction in the Fairways Districts is wrapping up. After construction is finished and work equipment will no longer be utilizing neighborhood roads, the developer will begin preparations for final paving and road handover to VDOT. Final paving is expected to be conducted in phases and will begin in June 2017. Please be aware that all vehicles will need to be removed from roadways during the paving process, so stay tuned for schedule information. Once final paving is complete, the handover, inspection, and acceptance of the roads by VDOT typically takes one year.

The final neighborhood to be built in the Fairways District is Fairways Ridge, adjacent to the golf club. (purple on the master plan) This neighborhood will be comprised of 231 Luxury Townhomes from Pulte Homes. Pulte is offering 3 different townhome designs with optional top-floor terraces on some homesites. Base Paving has been completed on the first 62 lots and construction has begun on the first sites. Remaining paving will be completed in 3 phases over the course of Summer 2017. Home construction is hoped to follow paving for those phases as well.

WOODS DISTRICT UPDATE

Although construction is winding down in many parts of the Fairways District of Potomac Shores, it is moving full steam ahead in the Southern Neighborhoods or Woods District. To follow is a summary of the various enclaves in the Woods District as well as other developer updates of interest to our community. The Woods District of Potomac Shores will include several distinct groupings of homes. The home styles and builders will vary,

much like they do in the Fairways District. Brookfield Homes has been selected as the builder for the Woods Bend and Woods Edge Districts. (Pink on the Master Plan) They are offering 7 models to choose from with prices starting from the low 500's. Woods Bend will include 50 single-family homes on single cul-de-sac/loop and Woods Edge will include 110 single family homes on 3 cul-de-sacs. Ryan Homes will continue to build homes in the Woods Gardens and Terrace Districts. (yellow on the master plan) Ryan will offer a total of 66 villas in the Woods Gardens District. These villas will offer main-floor living convenience. Ryan will also offer 184 traditional 3 level townhomes in their Woods Terrace District. Three different models will be available. Construction in the

Gardens and Terrace Districts is hoped to begin in early summer 2017. One additional section is planned for the Woods District but plans are not yet finalized for this section.

MISCELLANEOUS UPDATES

SunCal is continuing to actively market the resort and town center. Negotiations are underway with an interested retailer for the first commercial parcel of the town center. Work is also ongoing to make way for the planned 234 bypass. Offsite road plan is expected to be submitted by mid-summer and plan for Route 1 improvements will be submitted approximately 3 months

Alcoholic beverages may be served within your own party, but please be mindful of any under-aged children in the building. Community Clean-Up Day

SATURDAY, JUNE 3rd 8:30 AM – 11:00 AM

Come out and join the Potomac Shores Trails Committee and your fellow residents as we remove as much trash as possible from the trails and adjacent areas to promote a sense of pride within the community. Trash in the streams should be removed only if reachable from the stream bank, without entering the stream.

The Trails Committee wants to suggest clothing and safety guidelines that will make the day a success for all participants.

Clothing...

Please dress according to the weather and wear...

- Long pants and long sleeve shirts to protect against scratches or cuts from sticker bushes.
- A hat to protect head and eyes from low branches – and maybe the sun!
- Garden gloves to avoid getting splinters from downed wood, bushes, and branches. (We will have disposable gloves for those who do not have them.)
- Old/rugged work shoes are also highly recommended.

Insect repellent is always useful against mosquitoes and other bugs that bite, and sunscreen is always recommended when outdoors.

Safety...

- Watch your step for gullies on the path, standing water, and marshy areas in the woods. [If there has been significant rain in the few days before the clean up, there may be puddles on the trail.]

- If you notice any areas with ruts and/or gullies or large downed trees, please alert someone on the Trails Committee. These will be the focus of trail maintenance efforts later in the spring and summer.
- The ground off the trail in the woods is uneven, with fallen branches. Also, gullies and holes may be hidden by leaves. Banks of the stream may be slippery. Be Alert!
- Poison ivy is starting to grow. It has shiny leaves, usually three leaves to a stem, and the stem can have a hairy appearance. Don't touch it!



- Drink water frequently to avoid dehydration, especially if it is hot out.
- We recommend working in pairs or small groups. **Children under age 9 should work with an older sibling or an adult.**
- If you happen to get a cut or serious scratch, let an organizer know right away.
- Think SAFETY at all times and stay alert. Having fun is what we want everyone to do, but being careless puts others at risk and is not appropriate for today's activity.

after that. Rough estimates indicate that actual construction of the 234 bypass is likely two years out. SunCal also confirms that the marina is still in their long-term plans for the community but turning this vision into reality will depend on market demand. Finally, a homeowner vote is planned for 2018 regarding earmarked funds for tennis court construction. Homeowners will be able to vote

whether these funds should be used for tennis court construction or provided to the HOA general operating budget.

Planning and design efforts are underway for phase 2 of the Potomac Shores Trail System. It is hoped that clearing/grooming of the trails can begin during winter

Cherry Hill CDA Board to Include Potomac Shores Residents

After a substantial and successful outreach campaign waged by many Potomac Shores residents early this spring, it appears the Prince William County Board of County Supervisors (BOCS) has agreed in principle to a plan to ensure the next Cherry Hill Community Development Authority (Cherry Hill CDA) Board of Directors will be predominately represented by Potomac Shores residents.

A new Cherry Hill CDA Board of Directors needed to be selected and voted on by the BOCS after the terms of the previous board expired on April 18, 2017. The outreach was necessary as it appeared Supervisor Maureen Caddigan, who represents a portion of Potomac Shores on the BOCS, was ready to reappoint many of the former board, none of whom live in Potomac Shores.

Under the proposed agreement, Supervisor Maureen Caddigan (Potomac District) agreed to a resolution offered by Supervisor Frank Principi (Woodbridge District) to amend the Cherry Hill CDA ordinance to increase the size of the Cherry Hill CDA Board to eight members, which is the extent allowed under Virginia law. Further, Supervisor Caddigan would appoint five of those members and Supervisor Principi would appoint the other three. The previous board was comprised of five members. The resolution requires a notice for a public hearing, after which the ordinance will need to be voted on by the full BOCS before the board will be seated, probably June 20. The majority of the land in Potomac Shores is located in the Potomac Magisterial District, while a portion of Po-

tomac Shores located north of Potomac River Boulevard stretching from River Heritage Boulevard to Sea Skiff Way, is located in the Woodbridge Magisterial District.

Supervisor Caddigan on April 11, 2017 appointed Christian Heath on Belle Isle Drive, Rosario Mendez on Silver Arrow Drive, Robert Warr of Twin Six Lane, and Mat Burgess of Spring Cress Drive as Potomac Shores residents on the Cherry Hill CDA board. She also appointed Hil-da Barg on Cherry Hill Road as a non-Potomac Shores resident to the board. Once the CDA board is increased to eight members, Supervisor Principi intends to appoint three board members from Potomac Shores.

Road Improvements

Coming Soon

Due to increased traffic volumes and a recent up-tick in traffic accidents, the intersection of River Ridge Boulevard and River Heritage Boulevard will receive a traffic signal according to the Prince William County's Transportation Department and the Woodbridge District Supervisor's Office. Survey work at the intersection has determined that utilities must be moved to make way for the construction of a right-turn lane on the eastbound lanes of River Heritage Boulevard. Washington Gas is currently working on the design plan for relocation of these utility lines. Tanya Gomez, Constituent Services Representative from Supervisor Frank Principi's office, reports that PWC Transportation Department has reported that "Once the design has been completed, the (utilities) relocation could take up to 2 months to complete, with the turn lane completion/signal (installation) approximately 8 weeks after that." An accurate timeline for the completion of the signal installation is therefore dependent upon redesign efforts in the hands of Washington Gas.
